## Summary

We travelled around the Bolivian Andes starting in the beautiful city of Cochabamba where we spent five days travelling in the cloud forest habitat, then we moved to the very high city of Oruro located at 3,800 metres for just one night. We drove through the altiplano, this habitat being a very flat plateau located between 3,800 and 4,200 metres in elevation that is shared with Peru, and finally we went to La Paz, the largest city in Bolivia with over one million inhabitants. Here we spent four days exploring the famous Yungas, with the summit at over 4,200 metres, the “Death Road” to Coroico and the beautiful Lake Titicaca, the highest navigable lake in the world.

### Day 1

**Sunday 4th November**

We departed from Gatwick on the 1720 flight to Madrid, from where we caught a connecting flight to Santa Cruz at about midnight. We arrived in Bolivia the following morning in plenty of time for our final flight to Cochabamba.

### Day 2

**Monday 5th November**

We arrived at Cochabamba at approximately midday after a 45 minutes flight from Santa Cruz and we met the three group members who joined us for the Highlands tour. The other six had come directly from the “Bolivia Lowlands” holiday. Lunch was after we checked into the hotel and right after that we went to our first birding spot, a nice big Andean Lake in the middle of the city called Alalay. We got here and started finding our first birds of the holiday, which included Fulvous Whistling Duck, Puna Teal, Cinnamon Teal, White-cheeked Pintail, Yellow-billed Pintail, Yellow-billed Teal, Rosy-billed Pochard, Andean Duck, White-tufted Grebe, Silvery Grebe, Puna Ibis, Western Cattle Egret, Snowy Egret, Neotropic Cormorant, Common Gallinule, Andean/Slate-coloured Coot, Black-necked Stilt, White-backed Stilt, Spotted Sandpiper, Lesser Yellowlegs, Greater Yellowlegs, Andean Gull, Picui Ground Dove, Glittering-bellied Emerald, Rufous Hornero, Wren-like Rushbird, Plain Tyrannulet, Many-coloured Rush Tyrant, Tropical Kingbird, Fork-tailed Flycatcher, White-tipped Plantcutter, Sand Martin, Blue and White Swallows & Barn Swallows, Great and Creamy-bellied Thrushes, House Sparrows (introduced in South America), Hooded Siskins, Shiny Cowbirds, Greyish Baywings, Yellow-winged Blackbirds, the very common Rufous-collared Sparrows, Sayaca and Blue and Yellow Tanagers, Grey-crested and Saffron Finches, among others

The afternoon was very good but our time was limited as we had to head back to the hotel for dinner and to get ready for tomorrow where we would be exploring the fantastic cloudforest of this beautiful region of Cochabamba.

### Day 3

**Tuesday 6th November**

Today we started very early, having breakfast at the Hotel, and immediately afterwards we were heading to San Jose Power Station in the area of San Miguelito, east of the city on the main and newer road to Santa Cruz and 98 kms from Cochabamba at about 1,800 metres in elevation.

It took almost 2½ hours to get there, but it was worth the journey as we saw 70 new species of birds for the trip, some of the highlights being Torrent Ducks, Swallow-tailed Kites, Broad-winged Hawk, Plumbeous and Band-tailed Pigeons, Sparking Violetear, Speckled Hummingbird, Long-tailed Sylph, Masked Trogon, Versicolored Barbet, Blue-banded Toucanet, Golden-olive & Lineated Woodpeckers, three species of parrots (Red-billed, Plum-crowned & Scaly-naped), Yungas Manakin, White-eared Solitaire, White-capped Dipper, Orange-bellied Euphonia, Three-striped Warbler, Spectacled Whitestar, Dusky-green Oropendula, Bolivian Brushfinch, Slaty Tanager, Superciliated & Black-eared Hemispingus, Blue-winged Mountain Tanager, Orange-eared, Saffron-crowned & Golden-naped Tanagers, the fantastic Straw-backed Tanager, Capped Conebill, Golden-eyed Flowerpiercer, Black-backed Grosbeak and much more.

Lunch was out in the field, and later that day we were back in Cochabamba for dinner which was again at the hotel and then it was off to bed after a long day in the field.

## Day 4

## Wednesday 7th November

Today we had another early breakfast as we would be setting off to explore the area known as Tablas Montes, located also on the same road to Santa Cruz, but closer to Cochabamba and a little higher in elevation than the day before. The habitat we would be birding today is basically the elfin or dwarf forest, a type of forest mainly dominated by small trees and shrubs. We saw 30 new species of birds for the trip.

Some of the highlights of today's birding were Sword-billed Hummingbird, the magnificent endemic Black-hooded Sunbeam, Violet-throated Starfrontlet, Amethyst-throated Sunangel, Scaled Metaltail, the fantastic Hooded Mountain Toucan and Mountain Caracara. Endemic species included Black-throated Thistletail, Light-crowned Spinetail, Streaked Tuftedcheek, Rufous-faced Antpitta, Trilling Tapaculo, Buff-banded Tyrannulet, Rufous-breasted Chat-tyrant, Red-crested Cotinga, Barred Fruiteater, Pale-footed Swallow, Chiguanco & Glossy-backed Thrushes and Citrine Warbler, while near endemics included Orange-browed Hemispingus, Hooded and Chestnut-bellied Mountain Tanagers, Blue-backed Conebill, Moustached, Grey-bellied and Masked Flowerpiercers, Golden-billed Saltator and Plushcap.

Back at the hotel we had dinner and went through the checklist and went through the plans for tomorrow, our last full day in Cochabamba.

## Day 5

## Thursday 8th November

After spending two full days in the cloud forest of this region, today we visited the other side of the mountain, going to Cerro Tunari, located on the western slopes of the Andes on the way to Oruro. It is only 17 kms from the city but the habitat is completely different, being drier, with shrubby vegetation and *puna* (grassland) habitat at higher elevations. We started birding at lower elevations and finished at over 4,000 metres in elevation. Today looked for the most restricted and highly localized birds in the whole country and luckily we found most of them.

As it was a new habitat for us, we encountered an amazing number of new birds for the trip - 37 new species, and some of the highlights were Black-winged Ground Dove, Andean Hillstar, Red-tailed Comet, American Kestrel, Aplomado Falcon, Grey-hooded Parakeet, Andean Parakeet, Rock Earthcreeper, Cream-winged &

White-winged Cinclodes, Tawny Tit-spinetail, Maquis Canastero, Rusty-vented Canastero, Streak-fronted Thornbird, Olive-crowned Crescentchest, Highland Elaenia, Yellow-billed & Tufted Tit-Tyrant, Cliff Flycatcher, White-winged Black Tyrant, Spot-billed Ground-tyrant, White-browed Chat-Tyrant, Dusky-capped Flycatcher, Andean Swallow, Thick-billed Siskin, Brown-capped Whitestart, Bolivian Blackbird, Rufous-bellied Mountain-Tanager, Giant Conebill, Black-hooded and Ash-breasted Sierra-finch, White-winged Diuca-Finch, Bolivian Warbling Finch, Rufous-sided Warbling Finch, Greenish yellow-finch, Band-tailed & Plain-coloured Seedeaters and, best of all, the most range-restricted bird in the whole country, the Cochabamba Mountain-Finch.

## Day 6

## Friday 9th November

Today was a travelling day as we needed to move to the city of Oruro, a small mining city located at over 3,800 metres in elevation, a place where we stayed for only one night, as we had to get to La Paz the next day. Oruro is in the basin of one of the biggest lakes in Bolivia, called Uro Uro, a must-visit place where we will have the chance for birds like Andean & James's Flamingos, Puna Plover, Andean Avocet and others.

So, we started quite early, went to pick up Bolivia's most popular dish - *salteñas* - savoury pastries filled with beef, pork or chicken mixed in a sweet, slightly spicy sauce - for lunch later, and began heading towards the western side of the country. We were only 214 kms from Oruro, a distance that takes about 4 hours and 20 minutes to reach non-stop, but of course we took longer than that, as we stopped several times for birding.

At our first stop in a place called Bombeo we had Spot-winged Pigeons, Bare-faced Ground-doves, Giant Hummingbird (spotted on the way up to Bombeo), Rusty Flowerpiercer, Puna Tapaculo, D'Orbigny's Chat-Tyrant and Rock Earthcreeper.

Moving on to our next stop along the road, in a place called Pongo, at over 4,000 metres in elevation, we stopped in a small patch of forest and had nice views of Cochabamba Mountain-Finch, Mourning Sierra-finch, the almost endemic Wedge-tailed Hillstart (female), Puna Yellow-finch and others.

At this spot after the birding, we had the *salteñas* for lunch and then we kept heading to Oruro, hoping to get there before dark to see some birds at the lake.

We finally arrived at Uro Uro lake and got some great birds for the trip. We had the three species of flamingos - Chilean, Andean and James's - (Thanks to John for finding these as well as Puna Plover) and we also had Crested Ducks, Andean Avocet, many Andean and Puna Teals, Slate-coloured Coots, and hundreds of Common Gallinules.

We finally arrived at the hotel in Oruro, and went out for a nice dinner and after that back to the hotel and off to bed.

## Day 7

## Saturday 10th November

Another travelling day, heading to La Paz for the last part of our tour of the highlands of Bolivia, but before setting off, and after breakfast, we went back to Uro Uro Lake and spent some time birding there. Today we had better views of the flamingos, and found new birds for the holiday like Mountain Parakeets, Rufous-naped & Puna Ground-tyrant, Black-billed Shrike-Tyrant, Brown-backed Mockingbird, Black-crowned Night Herons,

Great Egret, Pectoral Sandpiper, Cordilleran Canastero and the almost endemic, and very endangered, Titicaca Flightless Grebe. We saw only one individual from the very small population recently found on this lake away from the Lake Titicaca.

After spending some hours at the lake, we started heading towards La Paz city, and on the way we stopped for lunch out in the field. As we were waiting for lunch to be ready, we had new birds including Short-billed Pipit, Band-tailed Sierra-finch, Puna Canastero, and many more.

We arrived in La Paz in mid-afternoon, and went straight to Casa Fusion, which was to be our home for the next three days of our tour in Bolivia. Dinner was at a restaurant and then it was back to the hotel to sleep, as tomorrow we would have another long day going to Las Yungas by way of the infamous road to Coroico.

## Day 8

## Sunday 11th November

Today was an exciting day as we went on one of the most dangerous roads in the world: the road to Coroico also known as the “Death Road”. This famous road is so called as it descends very steeply to the town of Coroico. The road drops more than 2,500 metres in elevation in only 65 kms. The first part of the road down goes through a nice, pristine area of Cloud Forest, then as the road gets lower in elevation the variety of birds get better and better, some of the highlights of today being Chestnut-collared Swifts, Tyrian Metaltail, Pearled Treerunner, Rufous-capped Antshrike, Diademed Tapaculo, Streak-necked Flycatcher, Mountain Wren, Three-striped Hemispingus and Scarlet-bellied Mountain Tanager.

Also, on the way to the Death Road, going over the summit, we had Andean Geese, Variable Hawk, and much more.

On the way back to La Paz, we did a final stop in a place called Cotapata and found nice birds like Tawny-rumped Tyrannulet, Brown-backed Chat-tyrant and Pearled Treenunner amongst others.

After another great day in Bolivia, we got back at the hotel, and went out for dinner in a nice Italian restaurant – a perfect end to an exciting day.

## Day 9

## Monday 12th November

Today the idea was to bird in higher areas than previously trying to find birds only found in this sort of habitat, so we were planning to spend the whole day out in the field.

We have had many visits to cloud forest habitats on this holiday, so at this point we were looking for specific birds, trying to get the best of this area.

The highlights for today were Giant Coot, Grey-breasted Seedsnipe (only seen by one member of the group, even though we looked for it and the Rufous-bellied Seedsnipe for almost the whole morning). Puna Snipe, Puna, Cinerous & White-fronted Ground-Tyrants were also seen in the same Puna habitat. Later in the day we continued down to Chulumani and got new birds for the trip like Crimson-mantled Woodpecker, Scribble-tailed Canastero, Southern Mountain Cacique and Black-throated Flowerpiercer.

Another excellent and tiring day but absolutely rewarding at the end.

## Day 10

**Tuesday 13th November**

Our last full day of the tour and today we went to the western side of the city on the way to Lake Titicaca, and to the road to Sorata, as we would be trying for another endemic, the amazing and highly localized Berlepsch's Canastero.

On the way we stopped for breakfast in a nice place overlooking Lake Titicaca and here we had Cinereous Harrier, Burrowing Owl, Peruvian Sierra-finch, many Andean Teals, Common Gallinules, Slate-colored Coot, Chilean Flamingos and many more.

After breakfast we continued to Sorata, and on the way we stopped again at the Achacachi marshes where we found Short-eared Owl (in flight), Andean Flicker, Plumbeous Rail (heard only), Puna & Cinnamon Teal, Greater Yellowlegs, White-cheeked & Yellow-billed Pintail, Andean Teal, and Yellow-winged Blackbirds.

We then kept on going to Sorata, and after two hours we finally arrived at the spot for the Canastero where we had waited for few minutes, the Berlepsch's Canastero showed up and we all had great views of this fantastic endemic of Bolivia. We also saw Black-hooded Sunbeam, Green-tailed Trainbearer, White-crested Elaenia, Black-throated Flowerpiercers, more of the Peruvian Sierra Finch, Blue and Yellow Tanagers, White-winged Black-Tyrant, Slender-Billed Miners, Puna Canastero, etc.

After spending the whole morning birding, it was time to start returning to La Paz, as tomorrow the group would have a long journey back to the UK.

Before reaching La Paz, we stopped at the Titicaca Hotel with a nice view of the lake while we had lunch, and afterwards, a little further on, we went to a place called Huatajata, where there is a local handicraft market and some of the group were able to buy souvenirs to take home.

Finally, we headed back to La Paz for our last dinner together.

## Day 11

**Wednesday 14th November**

This morning we drove out to El Alto Airport to begin our journeys home, after a memorable holiday in the high mountains of this fascinating country. The birding had been outstanding, and we also had some opportunities to enjoy the local culture, creating memories which will stay with us for a very long time.
