Day 1

Tuesday 7th August

Yanacocha –Alambi

We started early in the morning, Edwin, our driver and I, picked up the group at 6 am at the Hotel Sebastian. We drove towards the northwest slope of the Pichincha (approx. 3500m). Some of the species that we saw were Black-chested Buzzard Eagle, Caranculated Caracara, Sword-billed Hummingbird, Brown-backed Chat Tyrant, Smoky-bush Tyrant, Golden-breasted Puffleg, and Red-crested Cotinga, among others. We started to descend to the Tandayapa Valley at the side of the Alambi River, with chances to see Slaty backed Chat Tyrant, and keeping an eye out for Torrent Duck. We reached Alambi Reserve in the lower point of the road at 1400m. It was great for hummingbirds: Western Emerald, Booted Racket Tail, Green-crowned Woodnymph, White-necked Jacobin, Purple-throated Woodstar and more! This place is also very good for tanagers that visit banana feeders and we looked at Silver-throated Tanager, White-lined Tanager, Blue-winged Mountain Tanager, amongst others. Checking the river nearby the property we also saw a Cock-of-the-Rock female nesting under a bridge! We stayed overnight at Sachatamia.

Day 2

Wednesday 8th August

Milpe-Mindo

We visited the Milpe Reserve at 1100m of altitude. This is the perfect spot for the Club winged Manakin, it took us a while to see it in perfect display, but we did it! Besides that, we enjoyed Choco Warbler, Collared Trogon, Bronze-winged Parrot, Scaly-throated Foliage Gleaner, Pale-mandible Aracari, Masked Water tyrant, and Golden Olive Woodpecker. We spent the rest of the morning in front of the feeders to check for Green Thorntail, Green-crowned Brilliant, White-whiskered Hermit and then it was time to go back to Sachatamia for lunch. In the afternoon we visited Mindo Town and drove on gravel roads, and had good views of Red-billed Parrots, Choco Toucan, Chestnut-mandible Toucan, Golden-headed Quetzal, and Torrent Tyrannulet. We finished the day with an excellent display of the Lyre-tailed Nightjar at dusk and Black-and-white Owl after dinner.

Day 3

Thursday 9th August

Angel Paz –San Tadeo

We had an early beginning to visit the lek of the Cock-of-the-Rock, we were very lucky with the weather and had amazing views of the birds displaying. We also saw the Rufous-breasted Nighthawk roosting and a female and juvenile of the Lyre-tailed Nightjar.

We started looking for the famous Antpittas and the first was Yellow-breasted at the side of the river, and climbing through a trail we got Ochre-breasted Antpitta and Giant Antpitta!!!. A female Golden-winged Manakin was around too but didn't stay a long time. After lunch in Sachatamia we visited the old Nono Mindo road in a section named San Tadeo, we saw Plate-billed Mountain Toucans, Powerful Woodpecker, Green and Black Fruit-eater, Andean Solitaire in a nest, Golden-naped Tanager, Beryl Spangled Tanager and more.

Day 4

Friday 10th August

Bellavista Area (Upper part of Tandayapa Valley)

After breakfast we checked the parking lot of Sachatamia for birds such as: Toucan Barbet, Pacific Hornero, Strong-billed Woodcreeper, Montane Woodcreeper, Squirrel Cuckoo, Red-faced Spinetail and some more that were feeding on the moths around the lamps. After breakfast we took the gravel road again and stopped for a mixed flock, getting great views of Grass-green Tanager, Hooded Mountain Tanager, Pearled Treerunner, Spotted Barbtail, Glossy Black Thrush, Streak-necked Flycatcher, Capped Conebill, Masked Trogon, Mountain Wren, Blue and Black Tanager; and Tanager Finch - it took us a while waiting for it to come closer and finally we got an excellent view! We returned to Sachatamia for lunch and then back to Quito taking the highway, staying overnight at Puenbo Birding Garden.

Day 5

Saturday 11th August

Papallacta Pass

Today we crossed through the Papallacta Pass to explore the eastern slopes, and stopped at the side of the highway to walk a little bit on the gravel road and we saw Giant Hummingbird, Tufted Tit-Tyrant, Black Flowerpiercer and just before getting back to the car, was the emblematic bird of Ecuador, Andean Condor!! It was soaring around the mountains. We then took the old road where we found Rainbow-bearded Thornbill, Blue-mantled Thornbill, White-chinned Thistletail, Andean Tit-Spinetail, Giant Conebill, and Tawny Antpitta. Walking a little bit and going by car we continued finding some species such as Red-rumped Bush Tyrant, Grass Wren, and Bar-winged Cinclodes. We tried the highest point of the mountain (approx. 4100m) for the Rufous-bellied Seedsnipe but it was cold and cloudy so we were not successful. We drove down and finished our lunch inside of the car because of the freezing weather! We saw an Ecuadorian Hillstar male around some bromeliad flowers. Next we stopped at the Papallacta lagoon for Andean Coot, Yellow-billed Pintail, and Andean Teal. Before we got to go to Papallacta Hot Springs we visited one of the entrances of the Cayambe Coca Ecological Reserve, and managed to have wonderful species like Black-chested Mountain Tanager, Buff-breasted Mountain Tanager, Black-backed Bush Tanager, and Masked Mountain Tanager.

Day 6

Sunday 12th August

Papallacta-Baeza-Guango

The morning started cold and rainy so we tried a little bit at the entrance of the Cayambe-Coca Reserve and even with the weather we saw Agile Tit-tyrant, Rufous-breasted Chat Tyrant, and Scarlet-bellied Mountain Tanager before it was time to go for breakfast.

After breakfast we decided to drive at least an hour to the lowest part of the valley to Baeza Pass, where we managed to see Highland Motmot, Lineated Woodpecker, female Cock-of-the-Rock the sub species of east slope, Spot-breasted Woodpecker, Yellow-browed Sparrow and after our box lunch we drove back to Guango Lodge. Next we tried for Torrent Duck at the side of the river and even when we didn't see it we still had Northern Mountain Cacique and Turquoise Jay. Arriving to Guango Lodge we paused to enjoy the hummingbird feeders, with species such as White-bellied Woodstar, Chestnut-breasted Coronet, Long-tailed Sylph and more.

Day 7

Monday 13th August

Guango

Some of us went birding around the lodge this cold morning, and the reward was to find a Torrent Duck female. Other species seen were White-naped Brush-finch; Black-crested Warbler, and Golden-crowned Tanager. After breakfast and with better weather the entire group joined the hike through the waterfall trail - we saw Purple-backed Thornbill, Slaty Brush-finch, and back to the river for a last try, a Torrent Duck female, close enough even for taking photos. Back at Puembo birding garden we stopped for few minutes next to the village to check for some birds, and Vermillion Flycatcher and Southern Yellow Grosbeak seen. Overnight at Puembo birding Garden.

Day 8

Tuesday 14th August

Transfer in Sacha Lodge

We flew from Quito to Coca, and we were taken to the Sacha house to get prepared for the motorized canoe. The trip in the canoe took us about 2 hours and when we arrived at the ware house we met our local guide Shanshu. We started to walk through the path and our first birds came; Black-fronted Nunbird, Yellow-rumped Cacique, and Gilded Barbet. After lunch we went to the rooms to prepare for the first activity, the paddle canoe. We started with the emblematic bird of the Amazon Region, the hoatzin, and found other species such as Rufous-tailed Flatbill, Pink-throated Becard, Silvered Antbird, Green and Rufous Kingfisher and more.

Day 9

Wednesday 15th August

Sacha Canopy Walk

We had an early beginning to visit one of the best observation towers in South America, and with great weather and we all started to spot birds; Crane Hawk, Chestnut-fronted Macaw, Blue and Yellow Macaw, Spangled Cotinga, Plum-throated Cotinga, Golden Collared Aracari, Yellow-bellied Dacnis, Opal-crowned Tanager, Crowned Slaty-flycatcher, Pied Puffbird, Slender-footed Tyrannulet and Red Howler Monkeys at a distance. After lunch we checked the boardwalk, an easy hike, finding species such as: Short-crested Flycatcher, Red-bellied Macaw, Buff-throated Woodcreeper, and White-tailed Trogon. After dinner we also tried for sights of Caiman and a Sungrebe before returning to go to sleep.

Day 10

Thursday 16th August

Sacha Observation Tower

It was great weather so we took the canoe for a short time and there was a Rufescent Tiger-heron fishing at the side of the stream, then, once at the observation tower, at 40 metres high, the activity started - Grayish Mourner, White-browed Purpletuft, Lawrence's Thrush, Rufous-bellied Euphonia, Yellow-browed Tody Flycatcher, Red-rumped Attila, Swallow-winged Puffbird, Many-banded and Ivory-billed Aracari were around us. In afternoon we went to the stream by canoe and at night after dinner we checked a spot for Crested Owl and it took us a while but we had it flying side to side.

Day 11

Friday 17th August

Sacha River Islands

Early in the morning, we canoed into the Pilchicocha lagoon where a Common Potoo was calling loudly. After a great view we went back to the Napo River to be on time to see the amazing Amazonian Umbrellabird before it flies - and we made it!! In total we saw three, besides Yellow-headed Caracara, and Greater Yellowlegs. We moved downstream through the Napo River to see parrots clay licks, and saw Yellow-crowned Amazon, Mealy Amazon, Dusky-headed Parakeet and Blue-headed Parrots. The next stop was at the River Island, where the best rewards were Oriole Blackbird, Orange-headed Tanager, Olive-spotted Hummingbird, Castelanu's Antshrike and good views from the beach of Yellow-billed Tern, Large-billed Tern, and Collared Plover. The weather became very sunny so we took to the river again to visit an Interpretation Centre of the Yasuni National Park. We enjoyed our box lunch and found more species; Cocoli Heron, Scarlet-crowned Barbet and back at the lodge, King Vulture.

Day 12

Saturday 18th August

Sacha Transfer

This day was basically to do the return journey back to Quito - it was a quiet trip, and on the river we saw Osprey, Southern Lapwing, and Swallow-tailed Kite. It was time to go back to the city...

Day 13

Sunday 19th August

Antisana

The last day was a visit the Antisana Ecological Reserve - we started at 6 am from Puenbo Birding Garden. Before we reached La Mica lagoon we had an amazing female Andean Condor flying above us. Once at the lagoon we saw Andean Ruddy Duck, Silvery Grebe, Many-striped Canastero, Stout-billed Cinclodes, Andean Lapwing, Black-wing Ground Dove, Paramo Ground Tyrant, and Paramo Pipit. We went for lunch at Tambocondor right in front of where the condors rest, and we saw a juvenile. After lunch we went to the airport to say our goodbyes....
