Day 0

Sunday 27th February

Travel from the UK

Day 1

Monday 28th February

Kolkata

Arrived in Kolkata this morning and drove from airport to our hotel the Hyatt and after lunch we went out for city sightseeing of Kolkata - we visited Victoria Garden and Botanical Gardens - situated 8 kms away from the city, on the west bank of the Ganga, covering an area of about 273 acres. Laid out in the year 1787, Calcutta Botanical Garden is one of the oldest and largest botanical gardens in India. We saw some Black Kites, House Sparrows, Asian Pied Starlings, Palm Squirrel, Asian Palm Swifts, House Swifts and more.

Day 2

Tuesday 1st March

Kolkata – Paro (Bhutan)

This morning at 05:30am we drove to the airport to fly from Kolkata to Paro-Bhutan. We reached Paro at 10am. We would be staying here for 2 nights at Janka Resort Paro. This afternoon we climbed to Taksang Monastery and we had lunch at Tiger nest and visited the Holy Monastery on the way. Today we saw birds like White Collared Blackbird, Rufous Sibia, Redstart, Grey backed Shrike and Yellow billed Blue Magpie.

Day 3

Wednesday 2nd March

Paro (Bhutan)

We had an early morning breakfast before driving to Chele La Pass which is 3,998 metres high. We could see the sunrise and with the mountains behind, and clouds surrounding it, it seemed like we were in heaven! We did excellent bird watching and saw some good birds like Spotted Nutcracker, Coal Tit, Red-Flanked Blue Tail, and Long tailed Thrush. In the afternoon we visited the National Museum at Paro, and did bird watching in Paro Chu River. Almost the whole day was spent birding around Paro town.

Day 4

Thursday 3rd March

Paro (Bhutan)

Today we started early morning to Punakha, and on the way we saw great views of the Himalayas and we visited the monastery and spent almost the whole day there, we also did bird watching and saw Mrs Goulds' and Fire Tailed Sunbirds and Flowers Peckers.

Day 5

Friday 4th March

Punakha (Bhutan)

At 5.00am we all met up for an early breakfast and in no time we were on our way to the Jigme Dorje National Park. We saw some good birds like Forktails, Kingfishers, Phylloscopus Warblers, Thrush Babblers etc.

Day 6

Saturday 5th March

Punkha (Bhutan)

Today was again an early start. At 4.30am everyone got together for tea and headed for Phobjika to see Black-necked Crane. The whole day was spent watching birds on the way and at Phobjika Valley. We saw more than a hundred cranes here; Black necked cranes are rare and are winter visitors in Bhutan. We also saw other birds like Tits, Crows, and Skylarks.

Day 7

Sunday 6th March

Punakha – Gangtey – Wangdue (Bhutan)

After breakfast we drove from Phobjika to Thimphu – it was a long road journey and took us 7 hours. The whole day we did bird watching. Today being Sunday the Heritage Museum and Painting School were closed, therefore we visited another monastery.

Day 8

Monday 7th March

Wangdue – Thimphu (Bhutan)

After breakfast we started the early morning drive Thimphu to Phuntcholing Border, making a few stops en route but the forest was very quiet. After driving for sometime we stopped again and this time we managed to see a few Streak-breasted Scimitar Babblers. We even heard a Brown Parrotbill but could not manage to see it. It was yet another day spent bird watching and we also saw Ibisbill, Thrush, Kingfisher, Ducks and Mammals.

Day 9

Tuesday 8th March

Thimphu – Phuntsholing (Bhutan)

Early this morning we drove from Phuntsholing to Darjeeling, and on the way we did some bird watching and by 5pm we were at the Elgin Hotel.

Day 10

Wednesday 9th March

Phuntsholing – Darjeeling

Early in the morning we visited Tiger hill for sun rise and after breakfast visited the Ghoom Monastery followed by city sightseeing. We visited tea gardens, Tibetans refuge centre, the zoo, and after lunch we visited Jorepokhri and Lepcha Jagat.

Day 11

Thursday 10th March

Darjeeling

We took the morning Toy train from Darjeeling to Ghoom Railway station. In the afternoon we visited Senchal Wildlife Sanctuary. There we managed to see some Whiskered Yuhinas, Green-backed Tit, Black-chinned Yuhina, Ashy-throated Warbler, Grey-crested Tit, White-collared Blackbird, and Greenish and Hume's Warbler. We walked a little further and we saw Chestnut-tailed and Red-tailed Minlas and the Yellow-billed Blue Magpie. Peter and I even saw a Yellow-breasted Fulvetta. We finally reached a lake which was a source of water for the town. From the lake we decided to turn around and head back.

Day 12

Friday 11th March

Darjeeling - Kaziranga

After an early breakfast at 6.30am we were on our way to our next destination, Kaziranga National Park. First there was a 3 hour drive to the Bagdogra Airport. When we reached the airport we were informed that our flight was delayed by two and a half hours. We reached Guwahati by 3.45 pm and after getting our luggage together, proceeded towards Kaziranga. We reached our hotel Wild Grass in the evening. On our way we did manage to see a few Little, Cattle and Intermediate Egrets, Asian Openbill Storks, Lesser Adjutant Stork and a few Little and Indian Cormorants. It was a long day so immediately after dinner we retired to bed.

Day 13

Saturday 12th March

Kaziranga

Early in the morning we went for an elephant ride in Kaziranga National Park. We saw Water Buffalo, Asiatic Elephant, One-Horned Rhinoceros, Swamp Deer, Hog Deer and Wild Boar. After breakfast we go on a game drive in the park. Kaziranga is a haven for birds and we managed to see over 90 species of birds today!

Day 14 / Day 15

Sunday 13th March / Monday 14th March

Kaziranga

It was another early morning elephant ride in the park and after breakfast we had two game drives in the park. There were many birds and mammals seen today. Among the birds we saw Cormorants, Herons, Egrets, Woolly necked stork, Geese, Ducks, Waders, Terns, Swamp Partridge, Babblers, Thrushes, Bristled Grassbird, Scarlet backed Flowerpeckers, and Spider hunter. With mammals we saw the One-horned Rhinoceros, Water Buffalo, Swamp Deer, Hog Deer, Asiatic Wild Elephant, Himalayan Squirrel, and Indian Giant Squirrel.

Day 16

Tuesday 15th March

Kaziranga – Kolkata

By 10.00am we had packed our bags and were on our way to Jorhat Airport heading towards Kolkata. By 5.00pm we had checked in at the Hyatt Hotel. Today we all bid our final good byes.
