## Highlights

We had a wonderful assortment of sightings on this tour. We recorded 108 butterfly species of which seven were endemic, along with 129 bird species. On our excursion to Riverston, even though the visibility was low due to mist, we still recorded 31 species of butterflies in one day. During the tour we also saw many mammal and reptile species. Overall it was a very successful tour.

### Day 1

**Saturday 27th February**

The group departed from London on a flight to Colombo, the capital of Sri Lanka

### Day 2

**Sunday 28th February**

We arrived at Colombo airport at 12.35pm and met the tour leaders. At 1.30pm we left the airport and headed towards Sinharaja Blue Magpie Lodge. We reached the hotel at 5.30pm and were welcomed with a cup of tea. In the hotel garden we saw Sri Lanka Hanging Parrot and Yellow-fronted Barbet. After checking in we did a short walk around Sinharaja village and spotted a number of butterflies including Jezebel, Common Lime Blue, Dark Cerulean and Common Evening Brown. We also saw some birds including Grey Wagtail, White-throated Kingfisher, Grey Hornbill, Crimson-fronted Barbet and Brown-capped Pygmy Woodpecker.

We returned to the hotel 6.15pm and met again for dinner at 7pm. Then, after a briefing about the next day, we retired for the night.

### Day 3

**Monday 29th February**

We started the day at 5.30am with breakfast and then proceeded, in jeeps, to the Sinharaja Rainforest. We entered the rainforest at 7am and encountered lots of butterflies: Blue Mormon, Bluebottle, Sri Lanka Tree Nymph, Sri Lanka Birdwing, Red Helen, Tailed Jay, Common Mormon, Spotless Grass Yellow, Common Grass Yellow, Three-spot Grass Yellow, One-spot Grass Yellow, Blue Glassy Tiger, Glassy Tiger, Common Crow, King Crow, Common Leopard, Common Sailor, Commander, Clipper, Gladeye Bushbrown, White Four-ring, Common Lime Blue, Common Cerulean, Angled Pierrot, Indian Cupid, Quaker, Sri Lanka Black Flat, Sri Lanka Hedge Hopper, Bush Hopper, Common Banded Demon, Restricted Demon and Tropic Dart. We also spotted a number of birds including Sri Lanka Junglefowl, Crested Goshawk, Emerald Dove, Layard's Parakeet, Crimson-fronted Barbet, Orange (Scarlet) Minivet, Sri Lanka Blue Magpie, Black-capped Bulbul, Ashy-headed Laughingthrush, Sri Lanka White-Eye and Orange-billed Babbler.

We returned to the hotel at 1.30pm for lunch and had planned to return to the rainforest at 3pm but, due to the heavy rains that followed, we walked around the hotel instead and encountered Blue-tailed Bee-eater and Black-Bulbul, and a Common Bronzeback Tree Snake.

We returned to the hotel at 6pm and did the checklist, followed by dinner and a briefing about tomorrow.

## Day 4

## Tuesday 1st March

We started the day at 5.30am with breakfast and then visited a house garden where we encountered the endemic Sri Lanka Spurfowl, Spot-winged Thrush and Indian Blue Robin. We then proceed on foot along the village road and saw plenty of butterflies including Sri Lanka Birdwing, Clipper, Red Helen, Psyche, Rustic, Grey Pansy, Common Lascar, Beak, Common Bushbrown, Common Palmfly, Purple Leaf Blue, Common Imperial, Pointed Ciliate Blue, Metallic Cerulean, Common Pierrot, Malayan, Chestnut Bob, Indian Skipper and Wallace's Swift. We also encountered some birds including Chestnut-backed Owlet, Sri Lanka Wood Pigeon, Brown Shrike, Sri Lanka Hill Myna and Sri Lanka Drongo. Other sightings included Sri Lanka Giant Squirrel and Common Rat Snake.

We returned to the hotel at 12.15pm and, after lunch, checked out and proceeded to Kandy. We reached our next hotel at 7pm and, after dinner and the briefing, retired for the night.

## Day 5

## Wednesday 2nd March

We had breakfast at 7.30am and then checked out of the hotel. Some of the group then visited the Temple of the Tooth while the rest stayed back and birded around Kandy Lake. Giant Fruit Bats, Stork-billed Kingfisher, White-breasted Waterhen, Spotted Dove, Rose-ringed Parakeet, White-throated Kingfisher, House Crow, Large-billed Crow and Loten's Sunbird were encountered, along with Water Monitor, Hard-shelled Terrapin and Soft-shelled Terrapin.

We left for Knuckle's around 10.30am and, en route, stopped to enjoy some King Coconut juice. At the stop we encountered Grey Pansy, Common Cerulean, Common Hedge Blue and Common Leopard butterflies. We reached the next hotel at 12.30pm and went straight for lunch.

After lunch we did a nature walk around the mountain and encountered Pea Blue, Indian Cupid and White Four-ring. As the weather was gloomy, not many butterflies were on the wing so we returned to the hotel early. On our way back we encountered Layard's Parakeet, Brown Shrike and Common Hawk-Cuckoo.

In the evening we did the checklist at 7pm which was followed by dinner.

## Day 6

## Thursday 3rd March

We started the day with breakfast at 6.30am and then left for Pitawala Patana mountain range where we enjoyed lots of sightings. We encountered Sri Lanka Birdwing, Ceylon Rose, Red Helen, Common Mormon, Blue Mormon, Mime, Blue Bottle, Tail Jay, Jezebel, Sri Lanka Lesser Albatross, Great Orange Tip, Sri Lanka Tree Nymph, Sri Lanka Tiger, Rustic, Common Leopard, Chocolate Soldier, Great Eggfly, Chestnut-streaked Sailor, Club Beak, Tamil Treebrown, Gladeye Bushbrown, Monkey Puzzle, Plumbeous Silverline, Red Pierrot, Common Crow, Common Pierrot, Common Cerulean, White Four-ring, Spotless Glass Yellow and Paint Bush Swift butterflies. We also saw a good number of birds including Brahminy Kite, Crested Serpent Eagle, Black Eagle, Booted Eagle, Sri Lanka Wood Pigeon, Green Imperial Pigeon, Alpine Swift, Crimson-backed Flameback, Hill Swallow, Ashy Prinia, Dark-fronted Babbler, Asian Brown Flycatcher and Sri Lanka White-Eye, along with Giant Squirrel and Indian Palm Squirrel.

We returned to the hotel at 1.30pm for lunch, and then relaxed until 3pm when we walked around the hotel spotting many of the birds and butterflies we had seen earlier. In the evening we followed our usual routine of checklist, dinner and briefing.

## Day 7

## Friday 4th March

We had breakfast at 5.30am and then checked out of the hotel. We then proceeded to Wasgamuwa National Park for a jeep safari. We reached the entrance at 8.30am and encountered a migration of 20-50 Common Albatross and Sri Lanka Lesser Albatross butterflies. In the park we saw Dark Wanderer, Crimson Rose, Sri Lanka Birdwing, Lime Butterfly, Blue Mormon, Common Mormon, Blue Bottle, Tailed Jay, Jezebel, Great Orange Tip, Mottled Emigrant, Lemon Emigrant, Blue Glassy Tiger, Blue Tiger, Plain Tiger and Angled Castor butterflies. We also encountered some mammals: Asian Elephant, Spotted Deer, Grey Mongoose and Water Buffalo. Birds in the park included Grey-headed Fish Eagle, Jerdon's Bushlark, Barred Buttonquail, Indian Peafowl, Asian Openbill, Woolly-necked Stork, Purple Heron, Indian Darter, Brahminy Kite, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Grey-headed (Purple) Swampen and Pheasant-tailed Jacana.

We had lunch in a restaurant at 1.30pm and then proceeded to a nearby lake where we encountered Peacock Pansy, Slate Flash, Grey Pansy, Tropic Dart, Dark Cerulean, White Four-ring, Chocolate Soldier and Common Sailor butterflies.

We then set off to Sigiriya and our next hotel, which we reached by 5.30pm and checked in. We met again for the checklist at 7pm before dinner.

## Day 8

## Saturday 5th March

Today we had breakfast at 8.15am. After breakfast we visited the Ritigala Strict Forest Reserve where we encountered lots of butterflies: Common Rose, Banded Peacock, Blue Mormon, Common Mormon, Lime Butterfly, Blue Bottle, Common Jay, Common Gull, Common Albatross, Lesser Albatross, Great Orange Tip, Lemon Emigrant, Mottled Emigrant, Dark Wanderer, Common Crow, Angled Castor, Common Castor, Common Leopard, Tamil Yeoman, Ceylon Lacewing, Chocolate Soldier, Peacock Pansy, Commander, Monkey Puzzle, Common Silverline, Plumbeous Silverline, Large Guava Blue, Grass Jewel, Lime Blue, Indian Skipper, Bush Hopper and White Four-ring.

We returned to the hotel at 12.45pm and had our lunch. At 3pm we visited the Sigiriya sanctuary and encountered more species of butterflies: Banded Blue Pierrot, African Babul Blue, Tiny Glass Blue, Dark Glass Blue and Lesser Glass Blue.

We returned to the hotel at 5pm and relaxed until 6.30pm when we did the checklist before dinner.

## Day 9

## Sunday 6th March

We again had breakfast at 8.15am and then left for Kalu Diya Pokuna, where butterfly sightings included Sri Lanka Birdwing, Crimson Rose, Common Rose, Common Gull, Yellow Orange Tip, Great Orange Tip, Blue Tiger, Common Tiger, Chocolate Soldier and Golden Angle.

We returned to the hotel by 12.15pm for lunch and then did the checklist as we had to return towards the airport today. We checked out at 2.30pm and set off for our airport hotel. We stopped en route at Kurunegala for evening tea before arriving at the hotel at 7.20pm. We had dinner at 8pm and retired for the night.

## Day 10

Monday 7th March

After breakfast we checked out of the hotel and proceeded to the airport. We said our thanks and goodbyes to the leaders before boarding a flight back to the UK where another Naturetrek adventure came to an end.
