## Highlights

In total we saw 20 species of mammals, 12 species of reptiles, amphibians and fish, and 159 bird species. Blue Whales were encountered on all three days of our sea excursions, which also included a sighting of a Bryde's Whale and many Spinner and Bottlenose Dolphins. The Leopards at Yala also graced our presence along with many other mammals including Asian Elephant, Samba and Spotted Deer, Wild Boar, Water Buffalo, Ruddy Mongoose, Grey Langurs and Toque Macaque.

### Day 1

**Saturday 4th February**

The tour started with an overnight flight from the UK to Sri Lanka.

### Day 2

**Sunday 5th February**

Arrive Colombo; travel to Weligama

The flight arrived at Colombo airport at 5.20pm, where Wicky and Indika met the group. We left the airport at 6.30pm and reached the Fisherman's Bay Resort at 9pm. After dinner we called it a night.

### Day 3

**Monday 6th February**

Weligama

We left the hotel at 6.30am with packed breakfasts and reached Mirissa harbour at 6.45am for our first whale-watching trip. At 8.15am we saw our first Blue Whale and had some good sightings. We had no luck with any other species and returned to the hotel at 11.45am, where we had lunch and relaxed until 3pm.

In the afternoon we visited the Kirala Kele sanctuary where we encountered Purple-faced Leaf Monkey, Water Buffalo, Indian Palm Squirrel, Indian Flying Fox, Bengal (Land) Monitor, Oriental Garden Lizard and Common House Gecko. Bird sightings included Lesser Whistling Dick, Indian Peafowl, Painted Stork, Asian Openbill, Black-headed Ibis, Indian Pond Heron, Spot-billed Pelican, Little Cormorant, Oriental Darter, Shikra, Brahminy Kite, White-breasted Waterhen, Red-wattled Lapwing, Caspian Tern, Lesser Crested Tern, Spotted Dove, Sri Lanka Green Pigeon, Greater Coucal, Asian Palm Swift, White-throated Kingfisher, Pied Kingfisher, Blue-tailed Bee-eater, Common Iora, Brown Shrike, Black-hooded Oriole, White-bellied Drongo, House Crow, Large-billed Crow, Red-vented Bulbul, Sri Lanka Swallow, Blyth's Reed Warbler, Common Tailorbird, Yellow-billed Babbler, Common Myna, Oriental Magpie-Robin and Purple-rumped Sunbird.

We returned to the hotel at 6.30pm and did the checklist at 7.30pm followed by dinner and a briefing for the next day.

## Day 4

Tuesday 7th February

### Weligama

After having tea/coffee, once again we left the hotel with a picnic breakfast at 6.30am. We encountered Blue Whales during our boat trip and returned to the hotel at 11.45am. En route we saw many Greater Crested Terns.

After lunch we relaxed in the hotel and set out for Galle at 3pm. We visited the Galle Fort and explored the UNESCO World Heritage site with its impressive ramparts, clock tower, lighthouse and many other architectural marvels.

We returned to the hotel at 7pm and did the checklist at 7.45pm followed by dinner and a briefing for the next day.

## Day 5

Wednesday 8th February

### Weligama

We left the hotel once again at 6.30am after tea/coffee amidst gloomy weather. Our sightings this morning included Blue Whales, Bryde's Whale, Bottlenose and Spinner Dolphins, Flying Fish and Green Turtle.

After returning to the hotel for lunch, we once again visited the Kirala Kele sanctuary where we encountered Black-crowned Night Heron, Wood and Common Sandpipers, Green Imperial Pigeon, Stork-billed and Common Kingfishers, Chestnut-headed Bee-eater, Crimson-fronted Barbet, Indian Paradise Flycatcher, Plain Prinia, Asian Brown Flycatcher, Scaly-breasted Munia and a Brown Mongoose.

We returned to the hotel and did the checklist at 7.45pm, followed by the briefing and dinner.

## Day 6

Thursday 9th February

### Yala

We had our breakfast at 8am and checked out of the hotel at 9am. En route to Yala we encountered many birds seen before, along with Pheasant-tailed Jacana, Gull-billed Tern, Little Grebe, Little Egret and Green Bee-eater. We also saw Grey Langur and Toque Macaque. We reached the Cinnamon Wild Hotel by 12.30pm, had our lunch and relaxed.

At 3pm we visited the Debara Wewa reservoir and did some birding. We saw Eurasian Spoonbill, Yellow and Black Bitterns, Indian Cormorant, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Kentish Plover, Crested Treeswift, Brown-headed Barbet, Ashy Woodswallow, Small Minivet, Clamorous Reed Warbler, Pale-billed Flowerpecker, Streaked Weaver and Tricolored Munia. As we returned to the hotel we saw Estuarine and Muggler Crocodiles, Wild Boar and Black-naped Hare. We did the checklist at 7.45pm, followed by the next day briefing and dinner.

## Day 7

Friday 10th February

### Yala

We had tea/coffee and left the hotel at 6am for our first jeep safari. The weather was hot and clear. The birds we encountered today included Woolly-necked Stork, Lesser Adjutant, Grey-headed Fish Eagle, Watercock, Great Stone-curlew, Yellow-wattled Lapwing, Pacific Golden and Mongolian Plovers, Pin-tailed Snipe, Black-tailed Godwit, Common Redshank, Marsh and Terek Sandpipers, Ruddy Turnstone, Little Stint, Orange-breasted Green Pigeon, Blue-faced Malkoha, Jerdon's Bushlark, Oriental Skylark, Brahminy Starling, Indian Robin, Loten's Sunbird, Indian Silverbill and Paddyfield Pipit. The elusive Leopard, Ruddy Mongoose, Asian Elephant, Spotted Deer, Sambar, Grizzled Giant Squirrel and Green Garden Lizard were also seen during our safari. We enjoyed our packed meals inside the park and leisurely returned to the hotel at 6pm, where we did our checklist at 7.30pm followed by the next day's briefing and dinner.

## Day 8

Saturday 11th February

### Yala

Once again we left the hotel at 6am after tea/coffee for our safari. Today we encountered Crested Serpent Eagle, Barred Buttonquail, Green and Curlew Sandpipers, Asian Koel, Grey-bellied Cuckoo, House Swift, Eurasian Hoopoe, Malabar Pied Hornbill, Coppersmith Barbet, Brown-capped Pygmy Woodpecker, Yellow-crowned Woodpecker, Bar-winged Flycatcher-Shrike, Sri Lanka Woodshrike, Ashy Drongo, White-browed Fantail, Ashy-crowned Sparrow-Lark, White-rumped Shama, Purple Sunbird and White rumped Munia, along with Asian Elephant, Water Buffalo, Spotted Deer, Toque Macaque, Grey Langur, Mugger Crocodile and many more species we had encountered the day before. Afterwards we returned to the hotel, had dinner and called it a day.

## Main Tour Day 9; Extension Day 1

Sunday 12th February

### Katunayake (Main tour); Sinharaja (Extension)

We had breakfast at 9am and checked out of the hotel at 10am. We reached the Silver Ray restaurant in Ratnapura at 1.30pm and had our lunch. After lunch we split up as two members of the group departed for Sinharaja for the birdwatching extension, while the rest set off to Katunayake for their final night's stay.

The main group reached the Airport Garden Hotel at 6pm and enjoyed a leisurely dinner. Meanwhile, the Extension party reached the Blue Magpie Lodge at 4.45pm. Whilst birding around the lodge, sightings included Yellow-fronted Barbet, Emerald Dove, Indian Swiftlet, Plum-headed Parakeet, Sri Lanka Hanging Parrot, Black Bulbul and Orange-billed Babbler. We had a briefing about the next day's program before dinner.

## Main Tour Day 10; Extension Day 2

Monday 13th February

### Return flight to the UK (Main tour); Sinharaja (Extension)

Those on the main tour checked out of the hotel and travelled to the airport in time for their flight back to UK, where the main tour ended.

Meanwhile on the extension, we left the hotel at 6am with our packed breakfast and lunch. We reached the Sinharaja Rainforest ticket counter and while there, we encountered Spot-winged Thrush. We had good weather

and light as we entered the rainforest. During a walk we encountered Common Rat Snake, Black-cheek Lizard, Hump-nosed Lizard, Sri Lanka Spurfowl, Red-faced Malkoha, Malabar Trogon, Sri Lanka Grey Hornbill, Lesser Yellownappe, Sri Lanka Drongo, Black-capped and Yellow-browed Bulbuls, Sri Lanka Scimitar Babbler, Dark-fronted Babbler and Brown-breasted Flycatcher. We returned to the hotel at 4pm and did some birding around the hotel until 5pm. In the evening we did the checklist at 7pm and then had our dinner, followed by the briefing for the next day.

### Extension Day 3

Tuesday 14th February

#### Sinharaja

We had a pre-breakfast birding session around the Sinharaja Rainforest buffer zone and encountered Sri Lanka Spurfowl, Green-billed Coucal, Ashy-headed Laughingthrush and many other birds seen before. We returned to the hotel for breakfast and then had time to relax.

After lunch we set out to the ticket counter area and saw Crimson-backed Flameback, Layard's Parakeet, Sri Lanka Blue Magpie, Sri Lanka White-Eye, Sri Lanka Hill Myna, Dull-blue Flycatcher and Jerdon's Leafbird.

We returned to the hotel and did the checklist at 7pm, followed by the briefing and dinner.

### Extension Day 4

Wednesday 15th February

#### Katunayake

After breakfast we checked out of the hotel and proceeded to Katunayake. We had lunch at Katunayake and reached our hotel at 2.30pm. We relaxed for the rest of the day.

### Extension Day 5

Thursday 16th February

#### Return flight to the UK

We checked out of the hotel and travelled to the airport in time for our flight back to UK, where another Naturetrek adventure came to an end.
