Day 1

Sunday 9th September

Our Kenya Airways flight to Nairobi departed from Heathrow in the early evening, arriving in plenty of time for us to catch our onward connection to Entebbe.

Day 2

Monday 10th September

We arrived at Entebbe International Airport at 10:30am where we were met by our guide Jude. After clearing immigration and collecting our baggage, we proceeded to 2 Friends Guest House in Entebbe, where we had time for some rest and relaxation after a long journey. Later in the afternoon we birded the Botanical Gardens and we saw many species including Ross's Turaco, Great Blue Turaco, Woodland Kingfisher, Broad-billed Roller, Black and White Casqued Hornbill, Hadada Ibis, Red-chested Sunbird, Palm Vulture and Hooded Vulture, among others.

We even saw some mammals like Striped Ground Squirrels, Guereza Colobus, Red-tailed Colobus and Vervet Monkey. With that, it was getting late, so we headed back to 2 Friends Guest house for an overnight stay.

Days 3/4

Tuesday 11th / Wednesday 12th September

After an early breakfast we collected our bags and boarded the vehicle, heading to Mabamba Swamp to search for the mighty Shoebill – perhaps the most sought after bird of the entire trip.

We were not disappointed, and by 9:15am we were watching and taking photographs of this impressive bird, from a distance of only about 10 metres or so.

Other species seen with it in the swamp included African Jacana, Malachite Kingfisher, Swamp Flycatcher, Winding Cisticola, Black Crake, Pied Kingfisher, Little Bee-eater, Long-toed Lapwing, Yellow-billed ducks, Long-crested Eagle, Angola Swallows, Fan-tailed Widow bird, Northern Brown-throated Weaver, White-winged Terns and Blue-breasted Bee-eater.

Later in the morning, we left Mabamba and started our drive to Lake Mburo where we spent two nights at Rwakobo Rock Lodge exploring this stunningly beautiful National Park. During our time here we were able to see many birds and mammals. Birds included African Finfoot, African Fish Eagle, Crested Barbet, White-backed Vulture, Lilac-breasted Roller, Green Wood-hoopoe, Striped, Woodland and Giant Kingfisher, Blue-naped Mousebird, White-browed Coucal, Red-chested Cuckoo, Sooty Chat, Fork-tailed Drongo, Pied Crow, Black-headed Gonolek, Grey-backed Fiscal, Yellow white-eye, Arrow-marked Babbler, Hammerkop, Yellow-billed Stork, Black-shouldered Kite, Lappet-faced Vulture and Lizard Buzzard, among others

Our mammal sightings were also impressive, including Burchells's Zebra, Impala, Eland, Common Warthog, Buffalo, Deffassa Waterbuck, Topi, Bushbuck, Olive Baboon and Giraffe.

Days 3-7

Thursday 13th – Saturday 15th September

After enjoying Lake Mburo National park for two days, we continued down south heading to Bwindi Impenetrable National park where we were to spend three nights.

On our way we had a couple of stops for birding and we saw a number of species including the Long-crested Eagle, Brown Snake Eagle, Black-headed Heron, Cinnamon-chested Bee-eater, Little Bee-eater, Streaky Headed Seed-eater, Red-necked Francolin, Woolly-necked Stork, White-throated Bee-eater, Cattle Egrets, Little Swifts, Speckled Mousebirds, Grey-headed Sparrows, Black-headed Batis and African Paradise Flycatcher among others.

Finally, we reached Mahogany Springs Lodge which was to be our base for one of the highlights of the holiday - Gorilla Tracking.

Gorilla tracking was done on day six of our trip, 14th September. Everybody in the group was excited about the day, and although it was hard going at times eventually we all made it up to see the Gorillas.

The following day Duncan had a second Gorilla tracking expedition, so Jude arranged for Nicholas, who is a site guide based in Bwindi, to take out the rest of the group bird watching while he accompanied Duncan for the second trek.

The group that remained with Nicholas saw lots of forest species including Bronze Sunbird, African Thrush, African Citril Finch, Dusky Tit, Green Sunbird, Yellow-rumped Tinker Bird, White-breasted Negrita, Luehder's Bushshrike, Bocage's Bushshrike, Red-capped Robin Chat, Grey-backed Cameroptera, African Dusky Flycatcher, Common Bulbul, Pink-footed Puffback, Tambourine Dove, Black-billed weaver, Blue-shouldered Robin Chat, Little Greenbul, Cameroon Sombre Greenbul, Red-rumped Swallow, Brown-throated Wattle-eye, White-naped Raven, Buff-throated Apalis, Black Saw-wing, Waller's Starling, Petit's Cuckoo Shrike, African Golden-breasted Bunting, and Grey-throated Barbet among many others.

Days 8-10

Sunday 16th – Tuesday 18th September

Sunday was the day to transfer to Queen Elizabeth National park, but before setting off we did a little birding around the Bwindi Forest, seeing Yellow-spotted Barbet, Bronze Sunbird, Brown-capped Weaver, Northern Double-collared Sunbird, White-throated Bee-eater, Black-necked Weaver, Green Sunbird, Buff-throated Apalis, Chubb's Cisticola, African Dusky Flycatcher and Cassin's Hawk Eagle,

Mammals included Blue Monkey, Red-tailed Colobus, Red-legged Sun Squirrel and Black and White Colobus.

We left Mahogany Springs Lodge heading to Queen Elizabeth at around 11:00 am.

Along the way we saw a number of mammals and birds, and when we got to Ishasha sector, which is part of

Queen Elizabeth National Park, we found Topi, Uganda Kob, Deffasa Waterbuck, Buffalo, Elephant, troops of Olive Baboon, Bushbuck, Warthog, Pink-backed Pelican, Sooty Chat, Martial Eagle, Hooded Vulture, Grey-crowned Crane, Black-headed Gonolek, Red-necked Francolin, Grey-backed Fiscal, Grey Kestrel, Blue-spotted Wood Dove and White-browed Robin Chat, among others.

We stayed at Mweya Safari Lodge for three nights which gave us enough time to enjoy the park, and during our stay we saw Elephants, Uganda Kobs, Warthog, African Buffalo, Lion, Banded Mongoose, Spotted Hyena, Giant Forest Hog and Bushbuck. New birds included Nubian Woodpecker, Black-bellied Bustard, Flappet Lark, Grey-headed Sparrow and Crowned Hornbill.

We also took a boat cruise along the Kazinga Channel, seeing Marsh Sandpiper, Ruff, Senegal Lapwing, Water Thick-knee, Yellow-billed Stork, African Spoonbill, Marabou Stork and Hammerkop, plus Elephants, Hippopotamus, Nile Crocodile and Nile Monitor Lizard.

Days 11/12

Wednesday 19th/Thursday 20th September

On Wednesday we had to leave Mweya safari Lodge and head to Kibale. The morning was spent travelling and we arrived to a rainy afternoon so nothing much was done. All the group were eagerly looking forward to tomorrow's encounter with Chimpanzees.

Thursday was the day for chimpanzee tracking and everyone was in good spirits and excited in anticipation of seeing these primates – our closest relatives. After an early breakfast we set off to Kibale National park Visitor Information Centre for the general briefing about the do's and don'ts while with the chimpanzees, and in fact before we encountered them.

At 8:30am the walk started, and between then and the group leaving the forest at 11.00am we saw the chimpanzees, and other wildlife, for which this park is famous. When we had all met up again we headed to the visitor centre for a hot lunch.

Later in the afternoon, after lunch, we went out again for another walk in the Bigodi swamp, that has a variety of both birds and primates.

Some of the primates we saw included Red Colobus, Black and White Colobus, Red-tailed Monkey and Olive Baboons among others.

Birds seen included Great Blue Turaco, Black-headed Weaver, African Blue Flycatcher, Red-eyed dove, Yellow-billed Barbet, Black Bee-eater, African Thrush, Black-headed Heron, Hadada Ibis, Common Waxbill, Bronze Manakin and Black-crowned Tchagra.

As it was getting late, we had to drive back to Papaya Lake Lodge for the night.

Days 13

Friday 21st September

This was the last day of the tour, and we had to travel back to Entebbe in preparation for the long journey

home

While on our way back we saw a number of bird species like the Long-crested Eagle, Grey-backed Fiscal, Black-shouldered kite, Striped Kingfisher, White-throated Leaf-eater, Western Banded Snake Eagle, Eastern Grey Plantain-eater, Fan-tailed Widow Bird, Common Fiscal and Great Blue Turaco, among many more.

Finally, we reached Entebbe at around 4:45 pm and checked in at 2 Friends Guest House for day room use/Dinner before heading to the Airport to check in for their international flight back to the UK, via Amsterdam.

We said our goodbyes to each other and that marked the end of a memorable trip.
